THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

Pursuant to the provisions of section 68115 of the Government Code, it has been determined that, due to crowds, street closures and a resulting inability of law enforcement to transport inmates for hearings, security checkpoints, and heightened concerns about potential terrorism, resulting in increased demands on law enforcement, associated with the June 15, 2017, Golden State Warriors' National Basketball Association championship celebration and parade, which will take place in Oakland, California, on June 15, 2017, there is a danger of public calamity and a danger to the Wiley W. Manuel Courthouse, René C. Davidson Courthouse, Alameda County Administration Building, and United States Post Office Building at 201 Thirteenth Street, buildings in which the Superior Court of California, County of Alameda, holds court. Upon the request of the court, it is ordered that the Superior Court of Alameda County is authorized to do the following:

- Hold sessions anywhere in the county, including in correctional and juvenile detention facilities, on June 15, 2017 (Gov. Code, § 68115(a));
- Declare that June 15, 2017, be deemed a holiday for purposes of computing time under Penal Code section 825 (Gov. Code, § 68115(d));
- Extend the time period provided in section 859b of the Penal Code for the holding of a preliminary examination from 10 court days to no more than 11 days in cases in which the examination is set to take place on June 15, 2017 (Gov. Code, § 68115(g)); and
- Extend the time period provided in section 1382 of the Penal Code for the holding of a criminal trial by no more than one day (Gov. Code, § 68115(h)).

This order applies to Court proceedings in the above-listed facilities in which the last day of the statutory time period would occur on June 15, 2017.
